NAESB AT A GLANCE: MONTHLY UPDATE

TRADING PARTNER AGREEMENT DEVELOPMENT: Mike Novak, Assistant General Manager, National Fuel Gas Distribution, and member of the Board of Directors (WGQ) and Executive Committee (WGQ and RGQ), reported the Trading Partner Agreement request is currently working its way through the retail quadrants. The Trading Partner Agreement identifies responsibilities of each trading partner when communicating a transaction electronically. The committees drafted the agreement based on the trading partner agreement the Wholesale Gas Quadrant has used for a number of years, but made it suitable for retail transactions. The goal was to make the agreement commodity neutral for use by electric and gas trading partners. There were only a few changes made to the existing Wholesale Gas document and there has been little if any dispute regarding the language of the agreement. The agreement is currently being reviewed by the Retail Supplier-Utility Interface Subcommittee and will then be reviewed by the WGQ Contracts Subcommittee. It is realistic that the document will be complete and supported by all three quadrants (REQ, RGQ, and WGQ) by the end of the year.

GAS QUALITY STANDARDS: Mr. Jim Buccigross, Vice President, 8760, Inc., NAESB Board Member (WGQ), and Executive Committee Chairman (WGQ), stated the gas quality reporting movement began with a request from Florida Power and Light. The WGQ Business Practices Subcommittee (BPS) drafted a modified standard in a short period of time. When the BPS was finished with its recommendation it had drafted a modified standard, a new principle and four new business practices to report gas quality information on gas pipelines' existing websites. The BPS was able to draft gas quality standards with relatively few new standards because of the existing internet reporting standards. These standards unanimously passed the WGQ Executive Committee a few weeks ago with minor changes made to one of the standards and the recommendation is now posted for member ratification. It is NAESB's expectation to provide a status report to the FERC by the end of October detailing the ratification of these standards.

VERSION O UPDATE: Ms. Rae McQuade, Executive Director of NAESB, reported on the status of WEQ Version 0 standards. Version 0 is an effort by the industry to look at reliability policies in place at NERC and move the portions of the policies that are in fact business practices to NAESB, while leaving reliability specific policies in place at NERC. One change is to ensure that the business practices and reliability standards are compliant with the NERC functional model, with two exceptions – the Interchange Authority and the Reliability Authority. The only duplication between NERC Version 0 standards and NAESB Version 0 Business Practices will be the TLR Procedure. NERC and NAESB will draft the TLR Procedure jointly and incorporate the same document into each organization's standards. Both organizations will jointly review and separate the business practices from the reliability standards in version 1, and should complete this work in 2005. The WEQ Executive Committee will vote on Version 0 on November 30th, followed by member ratification of the Version 0 business practices by December 31st. NAESB expects to file these business practices with the FERC in January 2005.

GAS CONTRACTS CHANGES: Keith Sappenfield, Regional Director, US Regulatory Affairs, EnCana Energy Marketing (USA) Inc., Board Member (WGQ) and Executive Committee member (WGQ), reviewed the work the WGQ Contracts Subcommittee has done to draft an annex to the NAESB gas contract for the the International Swaps and Derivatives Association (ISDA). On October 15th, the NAESB Gas Contracts Subcommittee voted to send the ISDA Gas Annex and a User's Guide to the WGQ Executive Committee for adoption as a model. This recommendation is currently out for formal industry comment. The WGQ Executive Committee will vote on the model at the November 18th Executive Committee meeting in Washington, DC.

OASIS 1A PROPOSED STANDARDS: Ms. Rae McQuade, NAESB Executive Director noted that the WEQ Electronic Scheduling Subcommittee jointly with the Information Technology Subcommittee have been preparing standards that would amend the OASIS standards already in place and have been collectively termed OASIS 1A enhancements to distinguish them from the longer term effort to develop OASIS 2. The OASIS 1A enhancements currently out for comment include: changes for redirects, multiple submissions, large generation interconnection and standards of conduct for FERC Orders 2004, 2004a, and 2004b. These modifications will be considered at the next WEQ Executive Committee meeting on November 16th. Other OASIS 1A standards are in development stages and include: public key infrastructure standards, resales, and sales and assignments of transmission service.



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New BOARD COMMITTEES CREATED: Rae McQuade, NAESB Executive Director, said three new committees were created at the last NAESB Board of Directors Meeting. These new committees will report to the Board of Directors through the Board Managing Committee. The committees are: (1) the Resources Committee (to review the membership and participation levels of the organization and take actions to increase both to meet the needs of the standards development activities), (2) Gas-Electric Interdependency Committee (to identify possible coordination efforts between the gas and electric industries that may result in standards development efforts), and (3) Retail Awareness Committee, (to increase awareness and acceptance of model business practices created by NAESB for the retail market).

OTHER TOPICS: Ms. McQuade noted that the 2005 Monthly Update Conference Call schedule is now available. Several standards out for industry comment that were not on the monthly update agenda include: a recommendation for the WGQ Electronic Data Mechanism that proposes a replacement to the existing EDM Manual; and a set of retail model business practices governing resolution of disputes occurring between suppliers and distribution companies that may arise when serving retail customers.

NEXT CONFERENCE CALL: The next conference call is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **December 15**, **2004**, at 2:00 pm Eastern. There will not be a monthly update call for the month of November.
